Discover God's World Unit 1: Chapters 1-7 PowerPoint Tests

Grade:

5th Grade/5th & 6th Grade Combination

Content Area:

Science

Description:

There are seven different PowerPoint presentations in this unit. A PowerPoint for Chapters one through seven of Discover God's World Science Curriculum is included. Each PowerPoint is the chapter test from Discover God's World. They are to be used when reviewing the test after the students have taken the test.

Key Concepts:

The Nature of Science, Living Things, Classification, Fish, Amphibians and Reptiles, Birds, and Mammals

Standards Addressed:

Life: Living Things

- Describe, explain and compare the structure and function of cells
- Identify the characteristics of living things and non-living things
- Use the standard classification system to group animals based on their characteristics
- Identify features of fish that distinguish them from other classes of animals

Specific Learning Outcomes:

Students that are visual learners are able to review the test visually with illustrations from PowerPoint presentations included to keep their attention.

Time Requirements for Lesson/Unit:

Preparation time-5 minutes to make sure your computer is on, PowerPoint is up, and projector is running properly.

Class time-20 to 30 minutes to have class read through test via PowerPoint and put the correct answers on their test in red or blue.

Teaching Strategies & Instructional Management:

I have the test graded prior to reviewing it with the students. The problems the students miss-I mark wrong, but don't put the correct answer in. I have a different student read each question and the answers to the question. Then as a class, the students answer with the correct answer. If the student missed the problem, they write the correct problem on their test in red or blue (using the opposite color that they used to take the test).

Accommodations, Adaptations, & Extensions:

Students that typically have a hard time staying focused while reviewing the test stay on task more. I find that when they are looking at the test in a different medium (PowerPoint) than what they took it on; it holds their interest longer. You could also modify the test by taking out the answers for students to take the test in PowerPoint.
