

Source of Data


- A random sample of 1,203 telephone interviews conducted November 7-11, 2012, immediately after the recent election.
- The standard allowance for sampling error in a sample this size is two percentage points, plus or minus.






Two percentage points are Atheists.







How important is religion in your life?




View of God




View of the Bible








Opinion on Current Issues

Government is providing social services that should be provided by religious charities.


Government should do more to reduce the gap between rich and poor.

Government has paid too much attention to the problems of ethnic minorities.







