
Source of Data - Part A

■ Random sample of 1,312 Columbia Union church members completed questionnaires on Sabbath mornings in 2003. At the 95th percentile of reliability, the allowance for sampling error is three percentage points (plus or minus).


Source of Data - Part B

■ The Center for Creative Ministry conducted telephone interviews with a random sample of 200 pastors across the NAD in October and November, 2004. The interviewers were not Church employees or the spouses of conference officers or staff. At the 95th percentile of reliability, the allowance for sampling error is seven percentage points (plus or minus).




Where members live relative to their church ...




It is important to start new congregations




Reaching unreached communities is more important than church growth




Willing for my local church to sponsor a church plant




Willing for 2 or 3 key people to leave my church for a new plant




I am personally willing to join core group for a church plant




How much might you personally be willing to give for church planting?








What if offerings are received by some method other than passing the plate?




What if people are encouraged to come to church in casual dress?






What if neither an organ nor a piano is used for music?




What if worship is on Friday night instead of Sabbath morning?




Years in Pastoral Ministry








Factors that led to decision not to go ahead ...

- 38% Church members against it
- 27% Lack of funding or a financial model that provides resources
- 23% Barriers such as timing, family situation, etc.
- 12% It was too much work.
- 8% Not allowed to by administration


Factors that led to decision not to go ahead ...

- 2% Process is too complicated




Have you ever heard Ron Gladden speak?




Your general reaction to what you read or heard?






