During the past two years the North American Division has conducted significant research into various aspects of its ministry approach to children. After careful review and study of the findings, many felt that the time has come to develop a new Sabbath School curriculum and program approach. A special taskforce has been established to further explore these issues and to make recommendations.

To assist the taskforce in its work the Division has asked the Church Resource Center to conduct a qualitative study of local church children's ministry leaders. The purpose of this study is to:

- 1. Document general feelings and perceptions of leaders toward the current Sabbath School program and lesson materials produced by the church.
- 2. Document general feelings and perceptions of leaders toward curriculum materials produced by non-Adventist publishers.
- 3. Identify specific elements of available curriculum materials that generate strong positive and/or negative feelings.
- 4. Profile by department, Beginner through Juniors, leaders feelings toward specific elements that should be kept, eliminated, changed or strengthened in the event a new curriculum is developed.

Purpose of the Study

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- There is a large reservoir of loyalty on the part of local church Children's Ministry leaders toward Adventist produced Sabbath School materials.
- The most appreciated component of Adventist Sabbath School material is the lesson, which is perceived to be very biblically based and doctrinally sound.
- Despite a strong preference and loyalty to the Adventist curriculum, most respondents could not identify anything to commend it, other than its Bible centeredness, familiarity, and denominational ownership.
- When compared with curriculum materials from four other publishers,
 Adventist materials taken as a whole ranked third in the areas of "student interest" and "involvement."
- A strong preference is given to those publishers who use an "active learning" style. Leaders expressed desire for "hands-on" materials to help in general programming and lesson study.
- There is a sense that the components that make up the Adventist curriculum are not "connected" in purpose.
- There is a preference and desire for offerings on audio and video tapes. This is especially true of small churches. Leaders want music on cassette and video tapes as opposed to being referred to books.
- The greatest level of dissatisfaction with Adventist materials is in the area of "visuals." Leaders want more color—everywhere. In this area SDA produced materials ranked far behind those of all other publishers whose materials were evaluated.

Executive Summary

Twenty focus groups were conducted in five North American locations. In four of the locations participants were recruited by local conference Children's Ministries Directors. In those areas where Regional Conferences existed those conferences participated in providing focus group participants. Recruitment for focus groups held in Silver Spring was done by the North American Division Office of Children's Ministry.

Four focus groups, one for each children's division, were held in each of the following cities:

- Portland, OR
- Denver, CO
- Hinsdale, IL
- Atlanta, GA
- Silver Springs, MD


In selecting focus group participants conferences were asked to consider the following:

- Experience in Children's Sabbath School work
- Representation of churches of all sizes
- Ethnic and gender mix
- Representations of younger and older workers

Participants were given two hours to evaluate and share, by written and verbal response, their opinions concerning materials produced by:

- Review & Herald Publishing Association/Pacific Press
- Scripture Press
- Group Publishers
- Standard Publishing Association
- Gospel Light

Nearly 140 leaders participated in the groups. The statistics used in this report represent the data received from 121 completed written surveys.



Respondents By Sabbath School Division

Methodology and Demographics

All but the first chart in each section of this report represent cases where respondents were given the opportunity to vote for TWO publishers whose materials they considered "best" in a given area. The values listed for each publisher on the horizontal bar charts represent the number of votes each received.

It should be noted that this report is more qualitative than quantitative in nature. The samples represented for each Sabbath School division are not significant enough in size to guarantee projectability of opinion to the total universe of leaders in each division. Statistics representing the total universe (Beginners - Juniors) however, have reliable projectability and provide general information that can prove helpful.

*Data was entered and analyzed using SPSS, a computer tabulation and analysis program for microcomputers.






"Which materials are most likely to foster student involvement?"




Percentages of First - Third Choices

Maybe even with the lesson, when they're in the desert have the sound effects tape to go along with the lesson, and I was thinking more of the younger children, for the four and five-year-olds. Something to make it more real to them. That's what I would like to see.







Percentages of First - Third Choices

"In your opinion, which of the publishers produced materials that would be most interesting to children?"




"Which materials are most likely to foster student involvement?"


"Whose music was the most contemporary?"







"Which publishers have the best hand-outs and/or activity sheets?"




Percentages of First - Third Choices

"Which materials are most likely to foster student involvement?"















Additional Focus Group Responses

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT:

- The Seventh-day Adventist Church continue to produce its own curriculum as opposed to publishing supplemental materials to be used along side that of other publishers. Leaders want material that is "doctrinally specific" rather than "doctrinally generic." Many feel more confident using only materials that have been "cleared" by the Church.
- The Church and its publishers commit themselves to development of an "Active Learning, Hands On" curriculum. That such developments are carefully done, but "fast tracked," and with a sense of urgency given the expressed needs of leaders, and to maintain market share.
- Our system of using multiple entities to produce components for Children's Sabbath Schools should be scrapped. The Church and its publishers must commit themselves to viewing their materials from a Sabbath School room perspective as opposed to that of the institutional board room, or treasury office.
- Creators of Children's Sabbath School materials should be more accountable to the total program. They should think "package" more than "component," and be expected to produce integrated materials. All directors charged with developing components for a given Division should work in proximity to each other. Further, they should work under the direction of one individual who is held responsible for development coordination and the quality of materials used in the Sabbath School room.
- Greater emphasis be placed on making Teacher and Program Leader materials more easily understood and user friendly. The Church should deliver as complete a package as possible, with all components together in an attractive container. There should be greater sensitivity to the amount of time needed to prepare programs.

Recommendations

or integrated

- The NAD Children's Ministry Taskforce give thought and specific guidance to curriculum developers concerning age appropriate programs and lesson topics.
- The total Sabbath School time focus on the lesson topic. A specific period should be identified as the "lesson time," during which there will be discussion and processing of previous activities.
- Bible texts used for lesson study and/or memorization purposes should receive the same treatment in all components. Use the same translation/s.
- All materials should be carefully evaluated for contemporary use of color and design. Our materials should look more "alive" and colorful.
- The church should be more creative. In addition to the 8 ½" x 11" printed materials, consideration should be given to providing items such as "Big Books," puzzles, crafts, and other visuals.
- That leaders be provided with audio and/or video tapes to assist in the music program. Where possible printed words and music should be included.
- An ongoing evaluation process be developed to measure progress in providing materials that have greater participation opportunities for children, and are of high interest to them.

Significant Vmarket research be conducted measuring attitudes of Sabbath School leaders and parents toward our "take home" papers.

Recommendations (continued)

- That Customer Service 800 numbers be prominently displayed on packaging and program materials. These numbers should be clearly identified as to purpose (i.e. ordering information, Help Desk). Every opportunity to remind the leader and/or parent that their Church is a full partner in providing spiritual benefits for its children should be taken.
- A marketing plan be developed in tandem with the new curriculum development.
- An annual census of local church Children's Ministry leaders should be conducted throughout North American for the purpose of developing a mailing list to be used to acquaint leaders with available product, training, and support structures.
