The Smoking Gun

Subject: Health and Life Skills Intended Grade Level: Grade 7

Description: This unit plan will help students to better understand the dangers of smoking, the benefits of abstaining and the tools needed to refuse peer pressure. Faith Integration: The Bible tells us to treat our bodies as if they are the temple of God. (1 Corinthians 3:16 "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?") God expects us to do everything to the Glory of God and that includes the treatment of our own bodies. This will be a requirement in their PowerPoint presentations; the inclusion of God's call for us to be healthy.

Management Plan

- Students have the first period of each day of the week to work through this project.
- Each student will be using their own computer
- Students will be working individually on the PowerPoint and corporately in discussions and the worksheet

Ethics Plan

- Plagiarism will be taken very seriously and so seriously covering how to properly cite information will be done in the first 2-5 classes depending upon how quickly they pick it up.
- Penalties of a drop in grade will be enforced to ensure they understand the seriousness of calling other peoples' work their own.

Assessment/Evaluation:

- The Rubric below will be used to assess their presentations
- No Paper and Pencil Test will be given. At the end of the Unit I will ask them to create their own plan for avoidance of Tobacco. This will be a pass/fail assignment.
- The worksheet done will be graded based upon right and wrong answers. (6 points)
- Participation and Attitude will make up 30% of their overall grade.

Follow-up Activities

• At the end of the month the school is hosting an anti-smoking campaign and is bringing in a display set up for students to walk through and observe. This will complete our unit on smoking
