

## **North American Adventist and USA History Timeline, 1782-2008**

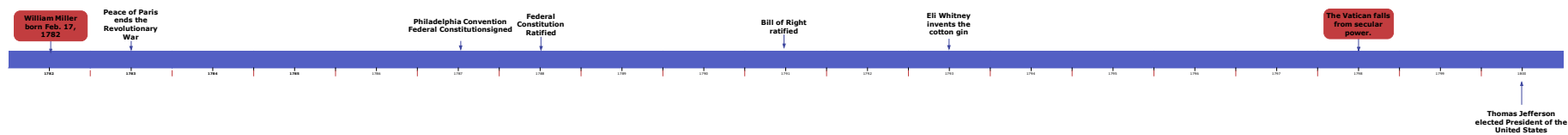

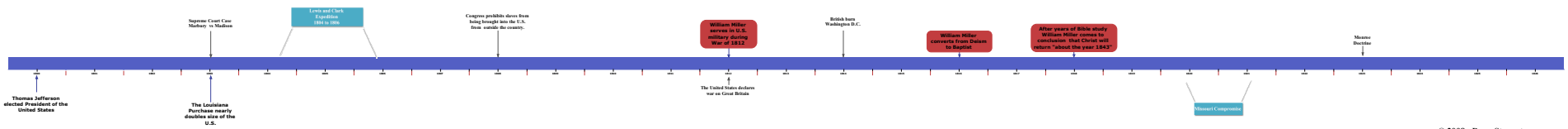
I humbly request of my peers to email me if you see any mistakes I have made. I especially desire more information for Adventist history of the 1900s. This recourse is a work in progress.

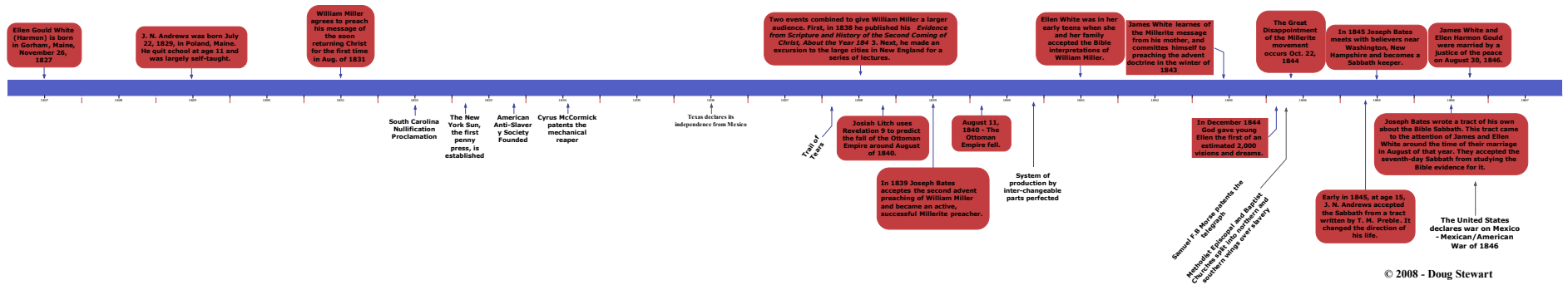

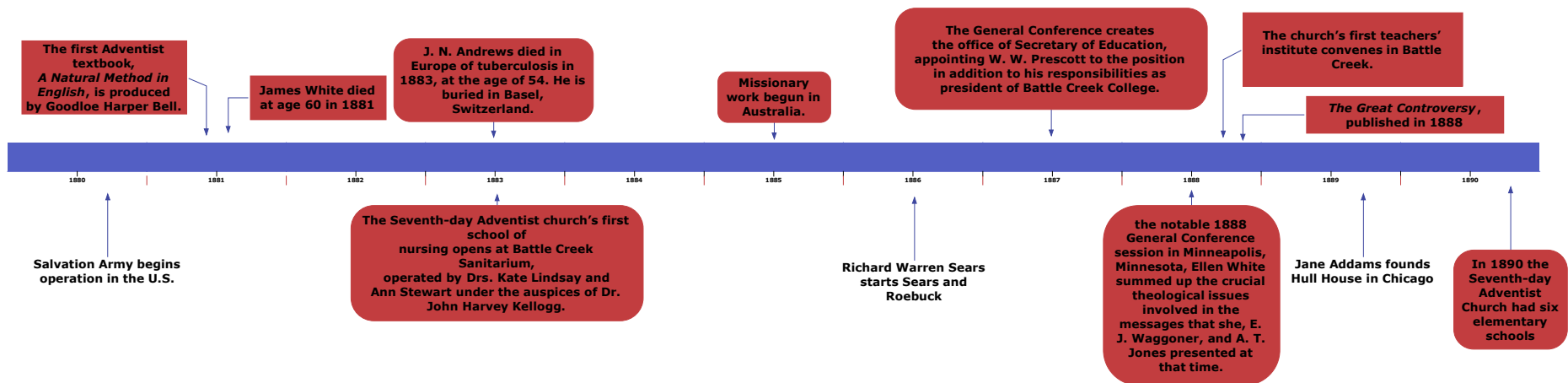


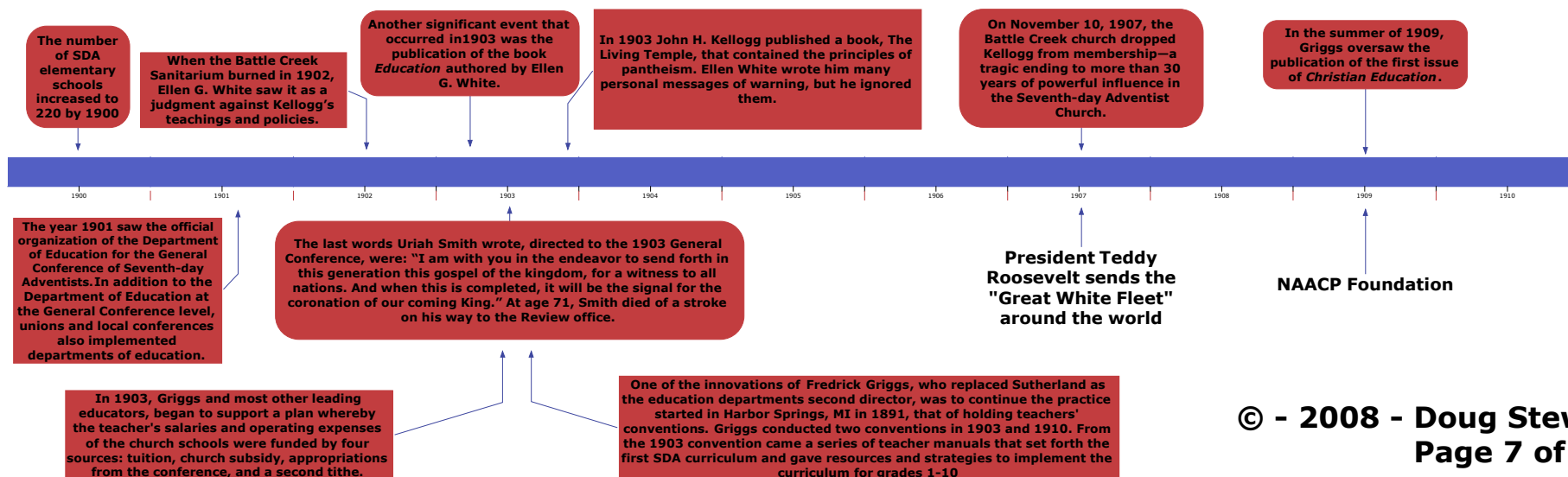




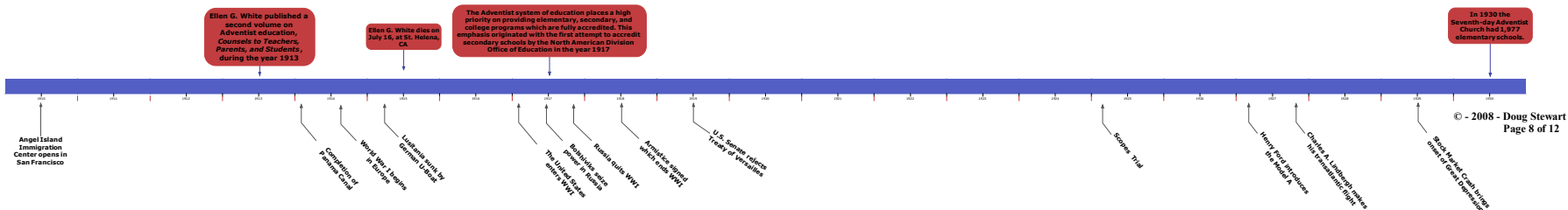












In 1930 the Seventh-day Adventist Church had 1,977 elementary schools.
